Handmade craftsmanship—in particular, high-quality mortise-and-tenon, half-lap, and wedge joinery—makes all the difference when comparing his studio's work to mass-manufactured products. Prices for the arbors range from \$675 to more than \$10,000 (www.prowellwoodworks.com).



Warm Welcom

- ◀ **A GARDEN GATE** creates a presence on each side of the fence, especially when it has a lot of character. Hand-forged wrought-iron gates can be had for as little as \$3800, but the manufacturer of this gate cautions that iron can become brittle due to its low corrosion resistance. Although wrought iron is available, Cross Custom Works (www.crosscustomworks.com) recommends considering a structural-grade cast-aluminum gate, like the one shown, for its high durability, low weight, and low-maintenance benefits. One more benefit? Aluminum gates are half the price of their iron counterparts.

AllWeather

- ▶ **OUTDOOR KITCHENS ARE** an increasingly popular backyard improvement. Year-round grilling, quick cleanup of the outdoor table, and the option of staying outdoors longer in nice weather are all big draws. In & Out Cabinetry (www.outdoorkitchencabinetry.com) will introduce four new colors to its all-weather cabinet lines this year: camel, moss, nutmeg, and pewter.
