SPRING BLOOMERS

'The flowers that bloom in the spring, tra-la' are, most popularly, hyacinths, fritilliaries and, of course, daffodils. But horticulturalists at Rutgers University working with the Goldsmith's Seed Co. in the US have discovered a simple, effective technique that adds aquilegias to the list of early flowerers. By chilling the seeds and then growing them through mild nights and cool days the plants will bloom sooner. This technique is the culmination of work by Dr Richard Merritt and Dr Thomas Gianfagna and also encourages the plants to bloom throughout the season. These 'super' seeds will be available commercially next year.

THE MIGHTY PELARGONIUM

The red spider mite is the bane of gardeners, as it chews its destructive way through many plants, including the pelargonium. However, help is at hand. Some varieties of pelargoniums are resistant to the mite and American researchers have discovered that these resistant varieties have long surface hairs which carry a form of a compound called anacardic acid. Experiments show that it should be possible to transfer this characteristic to commercial varieties without too much trouble, producing pelargoniums that are mightier than the mite.
