Gate Builder Finds the Web Can Open Doors

A strong streak of creativity runs in **Charles Prowell's** family. The Sebastopol furniture maker-gate builder learned woodworking from his father and grandfather, and was influenced by his mother, a designer and artist.

Prowell has taken this family tradition and put his own mark on it. "I've always preferred to create a look over the years that's synonymous with my work," he says. This look includes a harmony with nature; his gates, for example,

blend with their settings and add an open, welcoming element to a home.

Prowell's custom-designed furniture runs the gamut from desks to dining room tables — "just about any piece of furniture in the house" — and ranges in price from about \$1,100 for a coffee table to \$2,500 or more for a dining room table.

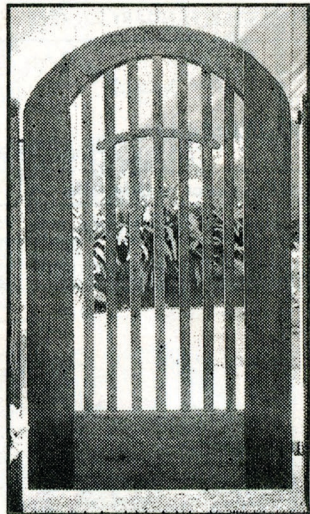
Now, Charles Prowell Woodworks has taken to the Internet to promote a line of six basic gate designs (a Western red cedar
